## Making Marbled Paper

We did this craft with my Kindergarten classes. The first time we did it, I had a parent volunteer and it was much easier but it was still doable by myself with the other class. The kids had a great time!

## **Materials**

Shaving cream (We used about 4 containers for 30 kids) small meat trays popsicle sticks food colouring cardstock cut in half paper towels cookie trays to be used under the meat trays to minimize the mess

- 1. Put a layer of shaving cream on the meat tray to cover the bottom of the tray.
- 2. Put several dots of 3 different colours of food colouring.
- 3. Use the popsicle stick to stir up the colour. They want to stir it enough to marble the colours, but not completely mix them in.
- 4. Take a piece of cardstock and press it down on the shaving cream.
- 5. Remove the paper and wipe the shaving cream off. Try not to rub too much or the colours will smear.
- 6. If you want, you can do another piece of paper with the same shaving cream.
- 7. Use the paper to make a card.

After making the marbled paper, I asked my class to describe how to do the activity.

Triston – We got a stick.

Zara – We got the pan.

Rachel – And the meat tray.

Elliott – We got the shaving stuff,
then we got food colouring. Then
you put the food colouring in the
shaving stuff, and then we mixed it.

Anthony – We whirled it with the
popsicle stick.



Keely – We got a paper and we put it onto the shaving cream. Then we got paper towel and we wiped off as much as we could.

Mercedes – We took our stick and we flipped some of it into the garbage.

Lauryn – We got a card.

Lukas – We put stamps on. It said "Happy Birthday".

Toby – We had these stuff and we put them on the paper and we had to press on the button and it made stars and all kinds of different stuff.

Mason – We glued them on the card.

Ivan – I gave it to Mom.

Jorja – It looked beautiful.

McKenna – It was messy!

Graysen – It was kind of fun.
